ORGANIZATION FOOTNOTES:	<p>NACVA Footnotes</p> <p>¹ Information herein can be found in "The Association" brochure published by NACVA and updated annually</p> <p>² Implied due to CPA requirement; most states require a five-year college degree to become a CPA</p> <p>³ Degree must be in field of business</p> <p>⁴ Experience is required, see the "The Association" brochure (http://www.nacva.com/PDF/association_brochure.pdf) for more detail</p> <p>⁵ Amount of required training varies depending on the candidate's chosen area of specialty in the CFFA Program. Can exempt out of part [and in some instances all] of the training showing proof of substantial experience.</p> <p>⁶ Applicants may apply to submit a client BV report in lieu of the Case Study if they have experience in business valuation.</p> <p>⁷ A report prepared under Federal Rule 26 within the last 3 years can be submitted in lieu of taking 2 hours of the 8 hour proctored exam</p> <p>⁸ CPAs are required to obtain 40 hours of CPE each year to maintain their CPA license in most states</p> <p>⁹ Designees who meet certain experience requirements may receive credit towards fulfilling recertification and other requirements</p> <p>¹⁰ Active in 6 matters as it applies to one's CFFA specialty area every 3 years, see "The Association" brochure (http://www.nacva.com/PDF/association_brochure.pdf) for more detail</p>			<p>AICPA Footnotes</p> <p>¹ The required training can be obtained from what is termed lifelong learning, which can come from CPE courses, college credit, authoring, presenting, lecturing, etc.</p> <p>² Over a period of 1.5 years CVAs, CBAs and CFAs were exempt from taking the exam. Normally, they are required to only have to take a 4 hour exam instead of the 8. ASAs are exempt from taking the exam entirely.</p> <p>³ CPAs are required to obtain 40 hrs of CPE each year to maintain their CPA license in most states</p> <p>⁴ AICPA required dues of \$385, plus \$350 annual ABV credential-holder fee</p>		<p>IBA Footnotes</p> <p>¹ The IBA holds out a fourth and fifth credential—Master Certified Business Appraiser—and Accredited in Business Appraisal Review—which are given to members of great distinction, experience, and contribution to the association</p> <p>² Applicants must have successfully completed 90 classroom hours of upper level course work or demonstrate 10,000 hours experience in BV</p> <p>³ Education and experience are not mandated, but a BV credential is required suggesting a minimum level of education and experience (or at least a level of proficiency in BV)</p> <p>⁴ No specification of how much required experience is provided</p> <p>⁵ Two references of expert testimony or alternatively take 16 additional hours of CPE in areas related to expert witnessing</p> <p>⁶ Can exempt out of exam if one holds BV credential from NACVA, ASA, or AICPA</p> <p>⁷ Starting January 1, 2000, credentialled members were required to document 24 hours of continued professional development every 2 years. This can be met through CPE training or by other means such as mentoring, speaking, writing, etc.</p> <p>⁸ Dues are reduced for members holding a valuation credential and for members providing various types of support to the Institute</p>			<p>ASA Footnotes</p> <p>¹ Refers to BV discipline only; the ASA supports practitioners in real estate, personal property and/or other appraisal services since 1952</p> <p>² An additional 2 years of experience are required for ASA and 1/2 year for AM, in any area of appraisal service, i.e., real estate, personal property, gems, business valuation, etc. Applicant can reduce the experience requirement by 1 year if CPA, CFA or CBI with 5 or more years experience in practice</p> <p>³ Applicants have option to take 96 hours of classroom training (4 courses) with a 3-hour test given at the end of each course or take an 8 hour proctored exam in one sitting</p> <p>⁴ Course is on Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice</p> <p>⁵ Must pass a one-hour ethics exam before sitting for BV exam, and pass a one-hour USPAP exam</p> <p>⁶ Holders of the ABV and CBA do not have to take the proctored exam to certify with the ASA unless holders of those credentials were grandfathered due to holding another recognized credential and never took the respective ABV or CBA proctored exam. All other requirements still apply</p> <p>⁷ Must also provide evidence of 60 hrs work in professional development, i.e., speaking, writing, authoring, course work, etc. on BV topics, or holding an appointed or elected position in the ASA</p> <p>⁸ Accredited Senior Appraiser dues are \$500 a year, plus there are required local chapter dues and assessments which vary by geographical location</p>
